A Real Gift To Us—Carry Your Family In Your Heart By: Brendan McVicker

On December 16th, 2000 Fr. Pinto conducted the second Fatherhood Retreat at St. Ignatius Retreat Center in Portland, Oregon following the initial Woodland, Washington retreat earlier the previous year. There was a growing interest in the Fatherhood Guidelines that Fr. Pinto spoke about in Woodland and we asked Father if he would again speak on them in this second retreat as well. Fr. Pinto happily taught on the Fatherhood Guidelines to the 70 men that attended. The Holy Spirit started something then because the Fatherhood formation was underway. On January 15th 2001 Fr. Pinto forwarded his speaking notes on the Guidelines so that the building of the initial draft <u>Carry Your Family In Your Heart</u> Booklet could begin.

By Fall 2001 the draft booklet was ready and Fr. Pinto asked that a small pilot group of men meet on a regular basis to go through the book teachings, regularly urging ... not to rush, "There is no rush in this work. You see the Lord knows that (continued on page 8)



7th Annual Real Catholic Men Conference

Fraternity of Fatherhood men have attended the annual Portland Real Catholic Men Conference for seven years now. This years June14th Men's Conference, held at the Proto-Cathedral St. James in Vancouver, was a blest event for all who were able to attend. With talks from Fr. Wade Menezes, Deacon Harold Sivers, Bill Diss and music by Daniel Oberreuter, approximately 200 men in attendance found inspiration for the manhood and Catholic faith.

Fr. Wade Menezes, CPM of the Fathers of Mercy, spoke on the Seven Capital Sins, their opposite Corresponding Virtues and Extremes. Through our understanding of these and frequent examination of conscience and confession, we can come to know ourselves better as men and find a greater balance in our spirituality. Deacon Harold Sivers' main point, spoken very emphatically, was that real men in our culture are an endangered species. He spoke of the challenges in our "feminized" culture and used King David as a model for our own spiritual journey. Bill Diss is the founder of Precious Children, a Portland-based ProLife group whose mission is to oppose Planned Parenthood and promote chastity among our young people. Bill spoke briefly of his own story, how he personally and professionally has paid the price for his belief and how other men can do the same, or at least take a stand. Fr. Wade closed the conference with a talk on Saint Joseph, the Terror of Demons, and what a powerful intercessor and resource he is for us, as men and fathers.

In addition to the great talks, men were able to network, personalize the topics covered, and make plans for future ways to gather and support one another. All of us left with a sense of the urgency that we need to commit ourselves in the roles of men and fathers. Fr. Wade quoted Thomas a Kempis at the closing Mass, (my paraphrase?) "You'll wish you had one more hour, with no assurance you will get it."

CARRY YOUR FAMILY IN YOUR HEART - A CALL TO HOLINESS

These guidelines to our Fatherhood Vocation & Spiritual Formation have been formatted based on the Fatherhood Retreat Guideline Teachings & under Spiritual Direction of Fr. Santan Pinto, S.O.L.T.

ONE WHO BLESSES

As fathers, we must also be men who bless. We bless everything. We bless our wives, our children. Why? Because this shows that we care for them, that we love them.

Make the sign of the cross on the foreheads of your wife, your children before they leave the house, when they return, when they go to bed. For the older children in whom you have not done this since they were kids you can give the blessing silently in your heart. You don't even have to touch them. Although, it is not too late to start.

As a man who blesses; you also protect and ask for God's protection on those you bless.

These little signs say, "I Love You!" Make it a habit. Incorporate this into your daily program. At night bless your children with holy water and have them bless each other. God's protection is with them.

Also, bless whatever endeavor you undertake – projects at work, at home, your travels; everything. If you know you are going into a tough meeting, silently bless each member as they walk in the door. You'll be amazed at the results.

A man, who blesses, is also a man who builds. If at work, someone curses God's name, silently offer a blessing for God's name. If someone tears down, then you build up. If some destroys, then you should create.

"Let the children come to me and do not prevent them; for the kingdom of God belong to such as these." "Then He embraced them and blessed them, placing His hands on them." (Mark 10:14,16)

Fathers-to-be, daily, lay your hands upon your unborn child (or children) and pray that the Holy Spirit fill your child (or children) with light, love and wholeness.

TOUCH MY UNBORN CHILD

Heavenly Father, I praise You and thank You for deeming this life to be and for forming this child in your image and likeness. Send forth Your Holy Spirit and illuminate her womb. Fill it with Your light, power, majesty, and glory.

Scripture Reading Psalm 112

The man who fears the Lord and greatly delights and follows in His commands is an upright generation and is blessed by the Lord. His generosity shall endure and lavishly he gives to the poor. The blessing of the just man is that he will stand firm in the face of evil and not be moved. The wicked man does not know how to go against the just man of God.

Scripture Reading Matt 19:13-15

Jesus blesses the children and urges them to come to Him. As parents, as fathers, we bless our children that they may have the protection of Jesus Christ. As parents we have a responsibility to lead our children to Christ. To prevent them the road to Jesus goes directly against our vocation. It is failure to say that we will let our children grow up and then they can decide what and if they want Jesus in their life. As fathers we are accountable, planting the seed of faith, hope and love in our children is our responsibility.

Scripture Reading Matt 18:10-14

We should bless our children and lead them to Jesus Christ. As Jesus says, "do not despise one of these little ones, for I say to you that their angels in heaven always look upon the face of my heavenly Father". How special children are in the eyes of God that their angels constantly look upon His face. How powerful the children's prayers must be!

Scripture Reading Mark 10:13-16

Jesus said do not prevent the children from coming to Him, but bring them to Jesus. We are accountable as Fathers to bring our children to Jesus. We need to imitate Jesus and embrace them and bless them. Show them daily that they are loved. We can learn about God our Father from our Children; we can learn to be child-like in accepting the gifts of God.

Scripture Reading 1_Peter 3:8-12

If we bless our children then we are responsible to conduct ourselves properly because Jesus has blessed us. We need to be of one mind, not use bad language, not speak ill of others. Seek peace and follow it. If we do this, the Lord's eyes are on us and His ear is turned to our prayer. Not only do we bless our children but bless our wife, our jobs, our houses, the homeless man walking down the street, people at work.
