

In 2017 my family's world was flipped upside down when my son was suddenly and tragically killed at the young age of 24. Afterward, I leaned into my faith and went to mass as often as I could searching for relief, peace, and some sort of understandable meaning behind my son's death. At the same time my family life began to quickly change into something far different than it had been before as they lost faith and were disillusioned by the church and downright angry with God. And as it turns out, in some ways, with me too.



It would be an understatement to say that our lives as we knew it were tragically disrupted and blown apart. A little over a year later a former co-worker named Jerry, who I had not had contact with for years, unexpect-



edly reached out to me. He had heard about my son's death and knew I was Catholic because we had attended daily Mass at the same church in the past. Although I was a long-time practicing, cradle Catholic I was unaware of the Fraternity of Fatherhood in Portland or anywhere else in the world for that matter, until Jerry invited me to attend a meeting.

There I met the incredibly faith filled, compassionate, kind, and courageous men that make up the group in Portland. I found out that there were other men who leaned into their faith, through the Eucharist and the


other sacraments, when times were hard. They are not shy about sharing their strong beliefs, sharing their failures, and sharing prayers and support for each other as we all navigate the challenges, tragedies, and joys of life. I did not say much at first and still say relatively little but, I gain so very much from being there at Mass, at breakfast and in listening to what the men in the Fraternity have to say; many of them seemingly guided by the mentorship and their former personal relationship that they had on earth with Father Pinto.

I am extremely grateful for Jerry introducing me to this wonderful group of Fathers and for the spiritual fruit, support, peace and understanding that I gain from the Eucharist and from each encounter with the Portland Fraternity of Fatherhood members. No doubt God's presence is there in a huge way, and I am eternally Thankful for that!

Oh, YES ... He is Present in The Eucharist - Brendan McVicker

There will come a time in our life, and for some, multiple times, that we find ourselves in an experience and there is no place to go for comfort. And the only real choice we have is to grab hold of our faith and go "to the foot of the cross". This is an experience of mine about gratitude for the real presence of Jesus in the Eucharist. For years, I didn't know if I should share my experience but lately I have received confirmation after confirmation that I should, beginning with my brothers in the Fraternity of Fatherhood. So, I am sharing it with you. And in today's world, if I can help just one person convert their heart to the true presence of Jesus Christ in the Eucharist then may it be so.... And may it be all for the Glory of God and the salvation of souls.



On Sunday, July 15th, 2012, I was working in the yard for several hours, it was a very hot day, and my right chest muscle cramped as I was just finishing sweeping the walkway. I thought that was weird. Then a few minutes later it happened again. Now I was really scared. I had never had that happen before so I thought I better get it checked, like right now.



In the emergency room, the doctors thought my main problem was dehydration and not drinking enough water on a hot day, but they wanted to check my blood for the cardiac enzyme troponin that is in your blood if you did have a heart attack. The first blood test showed no enzyme, which is good. The doctors said I couldn't leave though because they needed to do a second test in 4 hours because sometimes it takes time for the enzyme to appear after the event of a heart attack. As I waited I started getting some hay fever symptoms and the doctor asked if I wanted some Benadryl. I said sure. And this is when everything changed. Within 10 seconds of the nurse giving me the Benadryl in my IV port, I felt an instant illness I can't describe. The last thing I remember was saying, "please help me!!". Then my heart stopped completely for over a minute and forty-five seconds. Total flat-line! When I came back, I opened my eyes to

alarms going off on the medical equipment in the emergency room and about 12 doctors and nurses working on me from head to toe; one of them directly to my left giving orders to the rest on what to do and what is being done and another pumping on my chest very hard. CPR hurts! Within another minute my heart stopped again for over a minute....flat-line. My wife was there for the whole event and she could not believe what she was seeing. They then shot me with adrenaline. I came back again and woke up to my body, legs and arms literally bouncing on the table because of the adrenaline impact on my body. The last thing I remember at that point was the doctor saying, "He is not going anywhere." The next thing I knew, I was waking up in Cardiac ICU the next morning wondering what the heck just happened. (...continued page 4)

Then a nurse came into my room, who was the most rude and nasty to both myself and my wife. I mean this was a scary nurse. I mean really scary. She literally threw a booklet at me and said read this on heart disease. Remember ..I was in ICU when this happened! She told me I had heart disease, that I would need to be medicated the rest of my life and began telling me things about my life style that I shouldn't do and that is why I have heart disease. My wife and I looked at each other amazed and told her none of what she just said about me was even true. It was shocking! She didn't even know me and continued to say things about me that were not true. It was evil.

I continued blood tests every 4 hours that day (7/16/12) and the cardiac enzyme which was now present began to level off and slowly decline. I was very worried about heart disease and what the ICU nurse had said to me. Doctors now concerned with the enzyme troponin present were not sure if the reason was that I did have a heart attack or if the enzyme appeared because my heart stopped due to the Benadryl apoplectic shock.

That night, still 7/16/12, after my wife went home, a lady from the hospital Catholic ministry came in to see me. He asked if I would like to say prayers with her. I said what I would really like is to receive the Eucharist if I could. She said sure and she went to the chapel to get the Eucharist. She returned, we said the Our Father together and I received the Eucharist at about 9:30PM or so. My daughter had brought me my Bible earlier that day and my healing cloth from Fr. Pinto was in it. After receiving Eucharist, I placed the healing cloth on my chest and with my Rosary in hand said the following.....

"Jesus, I know you are with me in the Eucharist. You know I have been dedicated to You in the Eucharist. I know all healing comes from You in the Eucharist. You have the power to make all things new again. If it is Your will Lord, You have the power to make my heart new. I ask this through the intercession of St. Mary and of Fr. Pinto. In the name of the Father, and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit." Done, that was it.

Immediately, my chest became very warm (even hot) and the warmth began to travel from my chest, to my arms, to my hands and into my legs, to my feet even. I could liter-



ally feel the heat travel through my entire body. I began to sweat from the heat to the point that my sheets were wet similar to what you experience when a fever breaks. It was incredible. I knew something took place. Something had happened to me. Was my heart made new? There was no doubt. I had a burst of energy. I felt wonderful and I slept very very good that night. The next morning (7/17/12), they then wheeled me out of my room to complete my cardiac tests (stress test, nuclear pictures etc.) beginning at 6AM until 10AM. I was very worried because when I finished each of the tests, the technician who finished my various stress tests mentioned that it looks like there is definitely heart disease. After each test they said the same thing, heart disease, BUT that the pictures would tell the whole story.

I was very scared that the tests did not go well. Emotions started to kick in, the tears flowed and I kept remembering

about that nurse in ICU and cardiac test technicians said about me having heart disease. I was worried! I kept thinking in my heart...how can this be, based on what happened to me the night before when I received Eucharist. I knew what happened, the night before, it was real. But all the technicians are telling me something different. I was back and forth with doubt.

After 4 hours of tests now complete around 10AM, I arrived back in my room and a priest was waiting in my room talking to one of my brothers and wife. He could tell I was upset. It was like he knew exactly what was going on with me. He gave me Eucharist and told me to "Trust" and "Do not be afraid". Soon he left.



I waited all day for test results. At about 3:00PM, the cardiologist finally came in my room, stood at the end of my bed and said, "Brendan, we really can't figure you out!". The cardiologist told me that I have absolutely NO heart disease what-so-ever. Zero! Like the heart of a kid. No sign of Heart disease at all. None! He said my blood in my heart flows absolutely perfect so whatever I am doing...keep doing it. There are a lot of people in this world with heart disease and you are not one of them.

All I could do is think "EUCHARIST", and thank you Jesus for what He did for me. And thank you Mary and Fr. Pinto for their intercession.

Every year, I am sure to attend Holy Mass, on this date, July 16th, which is also the Feast of Our Lady of Mount Carmel, I give gratitude to Jesus in the Eucharist for what He did for me and continues to do for me. Oh Yes, He is Present in The Eucharist. But what was the Lord teaching me also? I have to trust. I must trust Him. I have to work on trusting Him daily in everything. I am still learning every day. Psalm 25 has always been special to me and now even more. God bless!
